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Definitions

- “Number of Students Who Began the Program” means the number of students who began a program who were scheduled to complete the program within 100% of the published program length within the reporting calendar year and excludes all students who cancelled during the cancellation period.
- “Students Available for Graduation” is the number of students who began the program minus the number of students who have died, been incarcerated, or been called to active military duty.
- “Number of On-time Graduates” is the number of students who completed the program within 100% of the published program length within the reporting calendar year.
- “On-time Completion Rate” is the number of on-time graduates divided by the number of students available for graduation.
- “150% Graduates” is the number of students who completed the program within 150% of the program length (includes on-time graduates).
- “150% Completion Rate” is the number of students who completed the program in the reported calendar year within 150% of the published program length, including on-time graduates, divided by the number of students available for graduation.
- “Graduates Available for Employment” means the number of graduates minus the number of graduates unavailable for employment.
- “Graduates Unavailable for Employment” means the graduates who, after graduation, die, become incarcerated, are called to active military duty, are international students that leave the United States or do not have a visa allowing employment in the United States, or are continuing their education in an accredited or bureau-approved postsecondary institution.
- “Graduates Employed in the Field” means graduates who beginning within six months after a student completes the applicable educational program are gainfully employed, whose employment has been reported, and for whom the institution has documented verification of employment. For occupations for which the state requires passing an examination, the six months period begins after the announcement of the examination results for the first examination available after a student completes an applicable educational program.
- “Placement Rate Employed in the Field” is calculated by dividing the number of graduates gainfully employed in the field by the number of graduates available for employment.
- “Number of Graduates Taking Exam” is the number of graduates who took the first available exam in the reported calendar year.
- “First Available Exam Date” is the date for the first available exam after a student completed a program.
- “Passage Rate” is calculated by dividing the number of graduates who passed the exam by the number of graduates who took the reported licensing exam.
- “Number Who Passed First Available Exam” is the number of graduates who took and passed the first available licensing exam after completing the program.
- “Salary” is as reported by graduate or graduate’s employer.
- “No Salary Information Reported” is the number of graduates for whom, after making reasonable attempts, the school was not able to obtain salary information.

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STUDENT'S RIGHT TO CANCEL

The student has the right to cancel this Enrollment Agreement and obtain a refund of charges paid through attendance at the first class session (**first day of classes**), or the seventh day after enrollment (**seven days from date when enrollment agreement was signed**), whichever is later. The notice of cancellation shall be in writing and submitted directly to the Financial Aid Office, and that a withdrawal may be initiated by the student's written notice or by the Institution due to student's academics or conduct, including, but not necessarily limited to, a student's lack of attendance.

Refund Policy: After the cancellation period, the Institution provides a pro rata refund of **ALL** funds paid for tuition charges to students who have completed 60 percent or less of the period of attendance. Once more than 60 percent of the enrollment period in the entire course has elapsed (**including absences**), there will be no refund to the student. If the student has received federal student financial aid fund, the student is entitled to a refund of moneys not paid from federal student financial aid program funds.

The registration fee of **\$75.00 is a non-refundable item**. Equipment, books, supplies, tools, uniforms, kits, and any other items **issued to and received by the student** would not be returnable. **Once received** by the student, it will belong to the student and will represent a liability to the student.

If you cancel this Enrollment Agreement, the school will refund any money that you paid, less any deduction for registration fee and equipment received. If you withdraw from school after the cancellation period, the refund policy described above will apply. If the amount that you have paid is more than the amount that you owe for the time you attended, then a refund will be made within 45 days of the official withdrawal date. (See refunds section below.) If the amount that you owe is more than the amount you have already paid, then you will have to arrange to pay that balance. Official withdrawal date is on the student's notification or school's determination.

Determination of Withdrawal from School: The withdrawal date shall be the last date of recorded attendance. The student would be determined to have withdrawn from school on the earliest of:

1. the date you notify the **Financial Aid Office** of your intent to withdraw; only the Financial Aid Office would be authorized to accept a notification of your intent to withdraw;
2. the date the school terminates your enrollment due to academic failure or for violation of its rules and policies stated in the School Catalog;
3. the date you fail to attend classes for a two-week period and fail to inform the School that you are withdrawing;
4. the date you failed to return as scheduled from an approved leave of absence; the withdrawal date shall be the last date of recorded attendance; the date of the determination of withdrawal will be the scheduled date of return from leave of absence.

Return of Title IV: Special note to students receiving Unsubsidized/Subsidized/PLUS, Perkins Loans, ACG/National SMART/Pell/SEOG grants or other aid: If you withdraw from school prior to the completion of the equivalent of **60 percent** of the workload in any given payment period, a calculation using the percentage completed will be applied to the funds received or could have been received that will determine the amount of aid the student earned. Unearned funds would be returned to the program in the order stated below by the school and/or the student. Student liability to loan funds will continue to be paid in accordance to the original promissory note terms. Funds owed by the student to the Grant programs are limited to 50% of the gross award per program received. Sample Calculation: completion of 25% of the payment period or enrollment period earns only 25% of the aid disbursed or could have been disbursed. If applicable, this would be the first calculation to determine the amount of aid that the student would be eligible for from Title IV Financial Aid programs. A second calculation would take place to determine the amount earned by the Institution during the period of enrollment.

Refunds: If any refunds are due based on the Return of Title IV Calculation **or** based on the Institutional Refund Policy calculation, any refunds will be made as soon as possible, but no later than 45 days from the determination of withdrawal date in the order stated in CFR 34, section 668.22. The order of payment of refunds is: 1. Unsubsidized Loans from FFELP or Direct Loans, 2. Subsidized Loans from FFELP or Direct Loans, 3. Perkins Loans, 4. PLUS (Graduate Students) from FFELP or Direct Loans, 5. PLUS (Parent) from FFELP or Direct Loans, 6. Pell Grant, 7. Academic Competitiveness Grant (ACG), 8. National SMART Grant, 9. Federal SEOG, 10. Other. This would apply in accordance to the aid programs available at this Institution.
